Dogs have a much better sense of hearing and smell than humans.

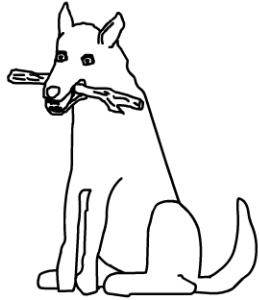
Irish Wolfhounds and great Danes are the tallest dogs.

What is the smallest dog?

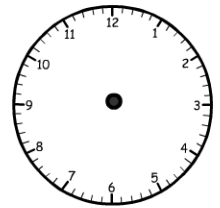
How long do dogs usually live?

Are Dalmatian puppies born with or without any spots?

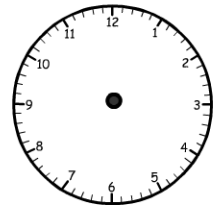
What type of dogs pull sleds through the snow in Alaska?

**Time** - Below is the daily timetable for my dog Spot. Mark the time on the clock faces.

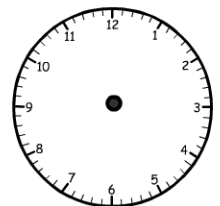
7 o'clock - feed Spot
